



VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN ACT (VAWA)

Student Awareness Fact Sheet (Macon)

The Violence Against Women Reauthorization Act (VAWA) Amended the Jeanne Clery Act to afford additional rights to campus victims of sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence and stalking. The Clery Act requires all higher education institutions receiving federal funding to collect and share information about crime on campus. The VAWA provides victims of sexual violence with support and assistance with notifying local law enforcement.

Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, also a federal law, prohibits sex discrimination against students, guests and employees of educational institutions. The regulations implementing Title IX are enforced by the U.S. Department of Education Office for Civil Rights and prohibit discrimination, exclusion, denial, limitation, or separation based on gender. This law is intended to end sex discrimination in all areas of education.

Ending sexual violence is very important.

- Sexual violence cases are reported at higher education institutions each year.
- Statistics demonstrate that someone in America is sexually assaulted every 2 minutes.
- The average number of sexual assaults each year is 237,550.
- 80% of sexual assault victims are under age 30.
- 1 in 6 women have been a victim of an attempted or completed rape.
